Location: Candle Tea is held in the Single Brothers House in Old Salem at 600 S. Main St. within the National Historic Landmark District of Salem. **School and Scout groups enter the Single Brothers from the rear of the building.** [See the map on this page](#) for general location and directions.

IMPORTANT FOR 2021

Covid 19 Pandemic Protocols: Candle Tea will follow [current local and state guidelines](#) as issued by the CDC, state of North Carolina, and local government and health officials. As of this writing (August 2021) mask-wearing is required indoors and will be required at Candle Tea unless the requirement is changed.

CHANGES TO YOUR RESERVATION:

If your group size increases beyond your original reservation:

Parking and Passenger Unloading

FOR SAFETY REASONS, NO UNLOADING OF PASSENGERS FROM BUSES OR CARS IS ALLOWED ON ACADEMY STREET BESIDE THE SINGLE BROTHERS HOUSE.

Buses for groups taking an official Old Salem tour:

- Park and unload next to the Old Salem Visitor Center. Walking from the Old Salem Visitor Center, cross the pedestrian bridge, turn left on Main Street, left on West Street, and look for signs to Candle Tea.

Buses for groups NOT taking an official Old Salem tour:

- Unload: GPS location is 126 West St., Winston-Salem, NC 27101. **Directions:** From Old Salem Road directly across from the Old Salem Visitor Center, turn onto Walnut Street. Immediately turn LEFT onto Salt Street and follow signs to Candle Tea. Turn LEFT onto West Street. Unload passengers at the Bus Unloading sign on the right.
- Park bus in the Salem Fine Arts Center: Turn RIGHT onto Old Salem Road. Go through stoplight at Academy Street follow Old Salem Road to next stoplight at Cemetery Street. Turn RIGHT onto Cemetery street. Go to stop sign. Turn RIGHT onto Salem Avenue. Go to stoplight at intersection with Ram's Drive. Turn RIGHT and go to bottom of hill. Buses may park on the far RIGHT side of the parking lot. Red and white directional signs will assist you on this route.

Return to pick up passengers from Bus/Van Parking Lot:

- Turn RIGHT onto Salem Avenue. Drive 0.2 mi. to the roundabout and take first exit. Drive 0.4 mi. to another roundabout and take first exit onto Old Salem Road Drive about 0.2 mi. and turn RIGHT onto Walnut Street (directly across from the Old Salem Visitor Center). Immediately turn LEFT onto Salt Street. Turn LEFT onto West Street. Pick up passengers at the Bus Loading/Unloading sign on the right. *(cont.)*

Car and minivan parking:

- In the small lot at the corner of Salt and West streets, across from the bus unloading above.
- In the Old Salem Visitor Center parking lot. Walking from the Old Salem Visitor Center, cross the pedestrian bridge, turn left on Main Street, left on West Street and look for signs to Candle Tea.
- On nearby streets where permitted.

Rest Rooms:

There are public restrooms available at the bus loading/unloading area near the rear of the Single Brothers' House and also behind the Boys' School at the corner of Main and Academy. There are **NO** public restrooms in the Single Brothers' House.

Accessibility: Candle Tea is held in the 1786 addition to the 1769 Single Brothers' House in Old Salem. Single Brothers' House is a National Historic Landmark. Unfortunately, this is not an ADA accessible building. Visitors will need to ascend several steps into the building and then will descend two sets of original staircases, one wooden with a turn and one stone with uneven surfaces. When the Tea is complete, visitors ascend several stone steps to exit the building in the back.

Cell Phones/Photography: We ask that you silence and/or turn off your phones during the Tea. Photography is permitted.
