Parking:

Car and minivan parking

- In the small lot at the corner of Salt and West streets, across from the bus unloading above.
- In the Old Salem Visitor Center parking lot.
- On nearby streets where permitted.

Walking Directions:

From the Old Salem Visitor Center, cross the pedestrian bridge, turn left on Main Street and look for signs to Candle Tea.

Rest Rooms:

There are NO public restrooms in the Single Brothers' House. Rest rooms are located at the Bus Unloading on West Street, and behind the Boys School at the corner of Main and Academy.

Cost: The cost of regular Tea is \$5 for adults and \$1 for children. School Tea is \$1/ student and Scout Tea is \$2/person, which includes a patch for each scout. Candle Tea is completely staffed by volunteers. All proceeds go to outreach ministries locally and globally. Your visit helps people in need around the world.

Payment Options at the Door: Cash or checks are accepted. We are unable to accept credit cards.

Reservations: A limited number of prepaid (nonrefundable) reservations at \$7.00 per person are available for Thursday, December 5th and 12th from 4:00 pm to 8:30 pm – only. Beginning in October, you may make reservations by using the “Reservations” tab on the website. PayPal and credit cards are accepted.

Budgeting Your Time at the Tea: Once you enter the Single Brother's House, the length of the Tea is between 60 and 90 minutes. Please plan accordingly so that you can fully enjoy Candle Tea. The length of waiting time in line is unpredictable due to weather and individual choice.

What to Bring: You can bring small personal items into the Tea. You will move through the Tea in a group of 35 people and space is limited in some of the rooms. Please leave large items in your car.

Strollers: Strollers can be left just inside the door at Candle Tea, space permitting, and we will hold them for you until you finish enjoying the Tea. There are 2.5 flights of stairs to be navigated during the Tea so strollers must be left at the front door. We have very limited space inside the entryway of Single Brothers House to hold items for guests.

Accessibility: Candle Tea is held in the 1786 addition to the 1769 Single Brothers' House in Old Salem. Single Brothers' House is a National Historic Landmark. *(cont.)*

Unfortunately, this is not an ADA accessible building. Visitors will need to ascend several steps into the building and then will descend two sets of original staircases, one wooden with a turn and one stone with uneven surfaces. When the Tea is complete, visitors ascend several stone steps to exit the building in the back.

Restrooms: There are public restrooms available near the rear of the Single Brothers' House and also behind the Boys' School at the corner of Main and Academy. There are no public restrooms in the Single Brothers' House.

Pets: Old Salem Museums & Gardens welcomes **leashed** pets on the streets and sidewalks of the historic district. The City of Winston-Salem can fine pet owners who do not obey the citywide "leash law" ordinance. Only service animals are allowed inside Single Brothers House and no pets are permitted in the historic gardens or cemeteries. There is no provision for where your pet could wait while you enjoy Candle Tea.

Photography: We ask that you silence and/or turn off your phones during the Tea. Photography is permitted.

Candle Sales: Moravian candles will be available to purchase in the candle making room. Only cash and checks are accepted – no cards.

- Sconce candles trimmed or untrimmed \$3.00
- 10" candles trimmed or untrimmed \$4.00
- Candle holders \$1.00
- Trim paper in pack of 8 sheets \$.50
