

Serve our Neighbors

Missions and Evangelism

- Home Church members contributed 5,179 pounds of food to Sunnyside, valued at \$8,907.88
- Church Interpretation volunteers shared the Moravian story with 8,604 visitors from 37 states and 13 foreign countries
- Hosted Saturday Night Fellowship dinner for downtown residents
- Diggs-Latham Elementary: donated 42 gift cards for staff at Christmas, served breakfast and snacks for staff on first day of school, sponsored Holiday Store for all students to select a gift for a parent, and tutored students through Reading Warriors
- Served meals for Sunnyside Freedom School, Shepherd's Center Older Adult Program, The Dwelling and the Overflow Shelter
- Provided toiletries and underwear for The Dwelling Shower Ministry
- Lovefeast gift bags for Cancer and Palliative Care patients at Forsyth Medical Center

Candle Tea

 Resumed full Candle Tea in the Single Brothers' House, welcoming over 7,000 guests. Dedicated volunteers worked long hours to cover more than 500 shifts over nine days. For the first time, guests were able to make reservations for all times and pay in advance. Proceeds raised from the 2021 Candle Tea (distributed in 2022) benefitted 15 organizations
