(Sister Deborah Aboudara representing the Provincial Elders' Conference, the Reverend Dr. Craig Atwood representing the clergy, and Sister Shirley Yoder representing the laity escort Sister Myers to the chancel as the following hymn is sung. According to tradition this text was written for the ordination of the first Moravian ministers in 1467.)

Come, let us all with gladness raise A joyous song of thanks and praise To God, who rules the heavenly host, God, Father, Son, and Holy Ghost.

God gave us faithful ones to lead And help us in our time of need; But, Lord, all power is yours alone, And you the work must carry on.

Father in heaven, fulfill your word; Grant us the Spirit of our Lord, That through your truth, which cannot fail, We may o'er every ill prevail.

(Sister Aboudara addresses the bishop.)

On behalf of this province of the Moravian Church, we request that Dana Myers be ordained as deacon.

We believe this candidate is sound in doctrine and faith and has a sincere intention to serve Christ and the church through the power of the Holy Spirit.

(Bishop Foltz responds.)

In response to your request, it is my joy to carry out this ministry of ordination on behalf of the whole church.

(The representatives return to their seats.)
(Bishop Foltz addresses Sister Myers.)

Sister Dana, do you trust that you have been brought by divine grace to know Jesus Christ as your Savior?

This is my humble trust.

Do you believe in the truth of the Old and New Testaments, as inspired by the Holy Spirit?

I do.

Do you freely accept the obligations of an ordained minister to study, pray, care for souls, preach, teach, and administer the sacraments in Christ's church?

I freely accept them.

Do you accept the commission to evangelize and give witness to the saving grace which is found in Jesus Christ?

I do.

Do you solemnly promise, as you serve in our Unity, to give obedience to the faith and order of the Moravian Church as these are formulated under Scripture and the Holy Spirit by our Synods and constituted authorities?

I solemnly promise obedience to them.

(Bishop Foltz addresses the congregation.)

Brothers and sisters, as representatives of the Body of Christ, will you uphold, affirm, and encourage Sister Dana in this ministry?

We will.

(Bishop Foltz continues)

In the presence of God and this congregation I acknowledge these testimonies with gratitude and praise to our Savior.

(Sister Myers kneels as the "Veni, Creator Spiritus" is sung. This hymn has been used at ordinations in the Christian church since the 9th century.)

Come, Holy Ghost, our souls inspire, And lighten with celestial fire; Thou the anointing Spirit art, Who dost thy seven-fold gifts impart.

Thy blessed unction from above Is comfort, life, and fire of love. Enable with perpetual light The dullness of our blinded sight.

Anoint each heart and cheer each face With the abundance of thy grace, Keep far our foes; keep peace at home: Where thou art Guide, no ill can come.

Teach us to know the Father, Son, And thee, with both, to be but One That through the ages all along Thy praise may be our endless song.

(The congregation stands and Bishop Foltz offers the prayer of ordination.)

Eternal God, in wisdom you govern all things, and from the beginning you have chosen faithful people to serve you in ministry, calling some apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, to equip all your people for the work of ministry and for the building up of the Body of Christ. Now bless and sanctify by your Holy Spirit your servant Dana, whom we, in your name and in obedience to your will, by prayer and with the laying on of hands, ordain for the ministry of the church.

(Bishop Foltz lays hands on Sister Myers and continues to pray.)

Eternal God, through your Son, Jesus Christ, pour out your Holy Spirit upon Dana; fill her with grace and power, and make her a deacon in your church.

O Lord, give to this your servant the grace and power needed to serve you in this ministry. Bless her proclamation of the word and administration of your sacraments so that your church

may be gathered for praise and strengthened for service. Make her a wise pastor, a patient teacher, and a faithful witness. Grant that in all things she may serve without reproach, that your people may be renewed, and that your name may be glorified in the church; through Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, forever. Amen.
