<u>July 4 Service in Salem Square</u>


Thursday, July 4, 8:30 AM (band prelude begins at 8:00)

On July 4, 1783, the Moravians of Salem held a worship service to thank God for the coming of peace after years of revolutionary war on American soil. Each July 4, Home Church marks the anniversary of that worship service. Come and enjoy early morning in Salem Square, listen to the band, sing and pray, and give thanks for the peace our Savior brings to our hearts. The Rev. Dr. Craig Atwood will preside.

Important News Update

A rabid fox was present in Old Salem and Happy Hill on Thursday, June 27. Our associate pastor, Rev. Dr. Craig Atwood, was attacked by the fox outside the church. The fox attacked his foot and did not break through his shoe or pant leg. Although his skin was not broken, as a precautionary measure, Rev. Dr. Atwood is receiving the prescribed series of shots for a rabies attack victim.

Please keep Craig in your prayers (these shots produce unpleasant reactions). Please also pray for other attack victims. We have heard of at least least two other attacks in the area, though information on the number and location of attacks has been inconsistent.

The fox was euthanized by police officers, and tested positive for rabies.
