## CONFIRMATION AND AFFIRMATION OF BAPTISM

(If the Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated in the same worship service, those affirming baptism join in the opening paragraphs of that service, and continue with the appropriate Affirmation forms beginning on page 171.)

(Standing)

In grace God called and chose the people of Israel and established with them a covenant: I will be your God and you will be my people. In that relationship they were to be freed from sin and become a blessing to all. Then God came to us in Jesus Christ and fulfilled that covenant for all people. Through Christ's life, death, and resurrection, God made for us a new covenant of grace.

**We come before you with joy, O God, to claim the promises of your covenant.**

Our Lord Jesus Christ instituted baptism as the visible means of entry into the new covenant. Baptism is a gift of God. In this sacrament, through grace and the power of the Holy Spirit, we are united with Christ, are cleansed by his saving work, enter into the fellowship of the church, and are called to a life of faith and willing obedience.

**Claimed by God in baptism, we pray that through the power of the Holy Spirit our lives may faithfully affirm the blessings of Christ's new covenant.**

(The minister addresses the candidates.)

As you present *yourselves* before God and this congregation, we call upon you to profess your faith.

Do you believe in God as your Creator and loving heavenly Father, in Jesus Christ as your Savior and Lord, and in the Holy Spirit as your Comforter and Sustainer, according to the Holy Scriptures?

**I do.**

(Candidates may profess their faith by means of the Apostles' Creed, the baptismal profession of the early church. The congregation may be invited to join in the Creed as an affirmation of their own baptism.)

Lord, make us one with all your children as we profess our faith, saying:

**I believe in God, the Father Almighty,  
creator of heaven and earth.**

**I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.  
He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit  
and born of the Virgin Mary.  
He suffered under Pontius Pilate,  
was crucified, died, and was buried.  
He descended to the dead.**

**Scripture Meditation 1/18/2026**

*But I said, "I have labored in vain; I have spent my strength for nothing and vanity; yet surely my cause is with the Lord and my reward with my God."*

- Isaiah 49:9

We've talked a couple times about the difficulty of being a prophet. Isaiah's thankless job is to preach to the Israelites through the destruction of Jerusalem and the Babylonian exile. Sometimes he wonders whether he's spent his life working for nothing.

We all have times when we feel we're not getting enough credit for the work we're doing. When I lived in New Orleans, I worked for a company that delivered healthy food to low-income people. One fall, a hurricane came through, and my coworkers evacuated, while I stayed behind to give away our inventory before it spoiled. I left the city late in the day and because of the traffic, it took my roommate and me 17 hours to drive to my parents' house in Dallas. We almost had to ride out the storm in my car.

I was upset because I felt that I made a big sacrifice, and none of my coworkers thanked me for it. While everyone was just trying to get their families to a safe place, I pouted because I wanted credit for my work!

As my relationship with God has changed and developed, I have found comfort in the idea that God sees me in everything that I do, and that there is no such thing as a thankless job when I act in the spirit of my beliefs.

Knowing that all the time is something I will have to spend my life working towards, but when I feel that I am not getting the credit I want, I try to remind myself that God is always watching over me, and that God is proud of me when I make the decision to do what I believe is right. -- Philip



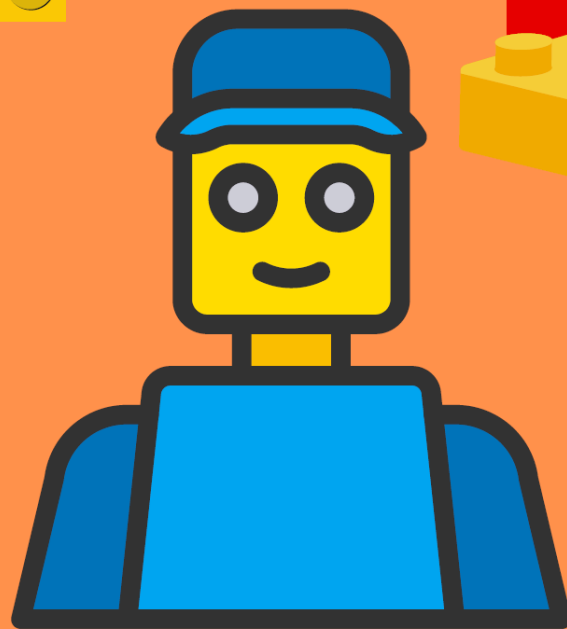
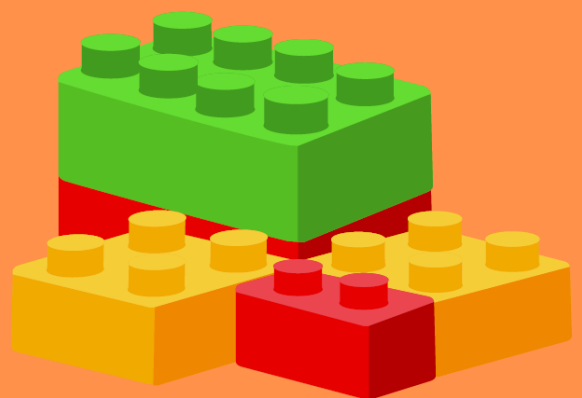
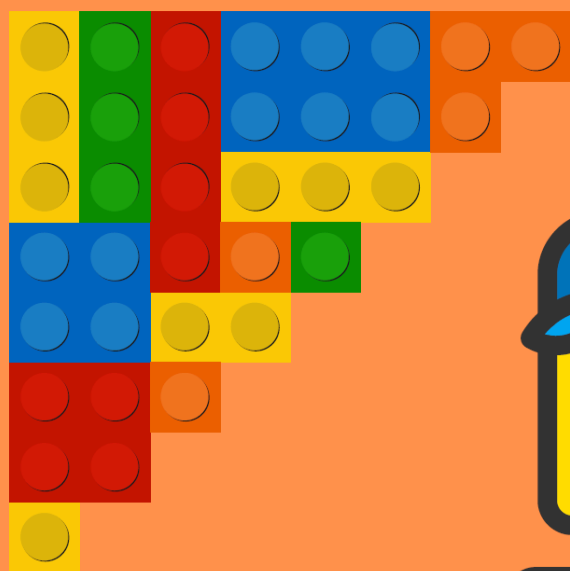

## **Andrews and Johns**

John the Baptist offered messages and a baptism that resonated with people. There was something about what John provided that fed people's spiritual hunger. Yet John's ministry was not about himself. When Jesus walked by, John quickly identified Jesus as "the Lamb of God." John reminded his followers that this is the person he had been telling them about and the reason of all he did was to help reveal the "Lamb."

*Are you like John*, who had a powerful experience revealing Jesus as the Lamb to him? What has God revealed to you that you are to share with others about Jesus? And as you share, are you able to keep the Lamb as the reason for what you share? There are not many who are a public persona like John. Martin Luther King Jr. was one. Could you be one?

*Are you like Andrew*, following someone who is spiritual? Today, there is a variety of spiritual leaders to help us actively seek the Lamb. How do those whom you follow, and who give you inspiration, reveal the Lamb? And when the Lamb is identified, are you willing to follow the Lamb, that is, to seek a personal experience? We hear of two who joined with John to allow themselves to fully follow the Lamb.

*Do you wait for someone to point out the Lamb to you?* Simon Peter was not a follower of John. His spiritual sibling Andrew revealed the Lamb to him.
